# JICS' Vision and Mission

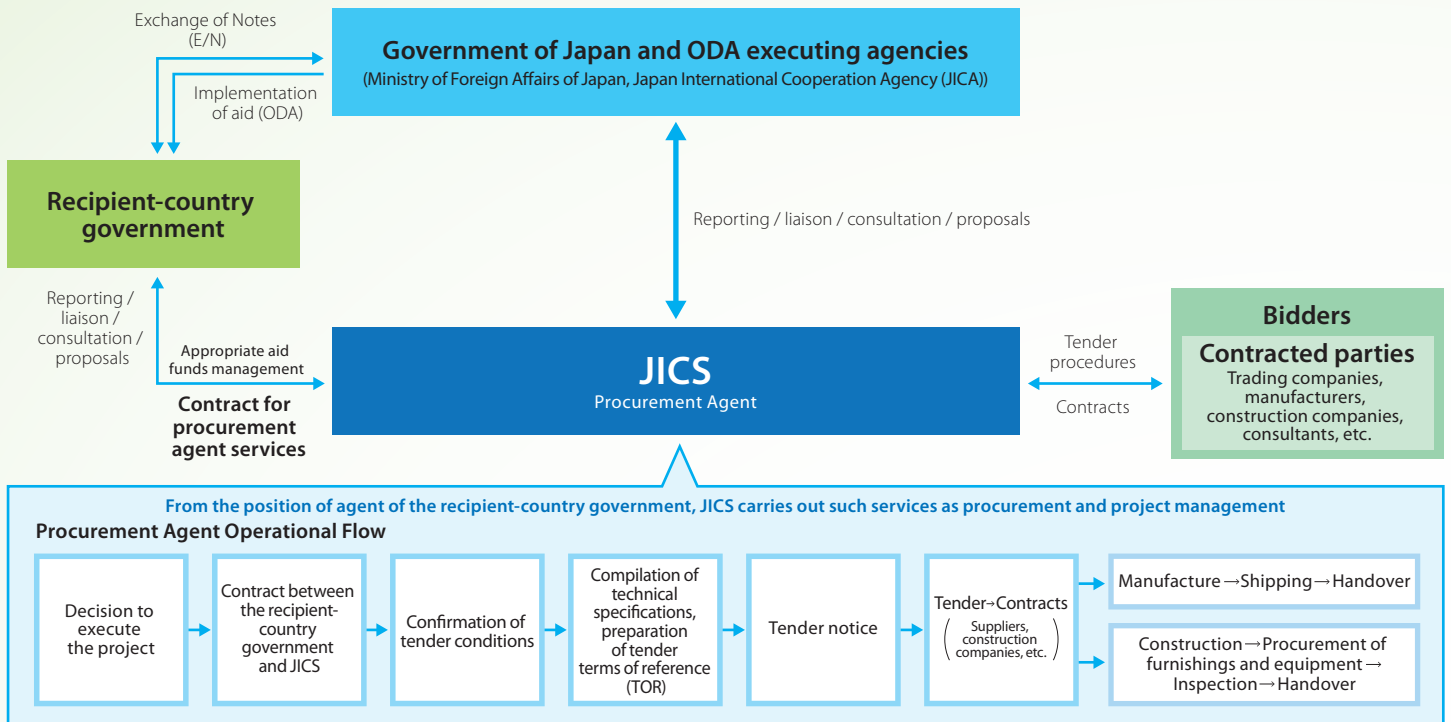
The Government of Japan provides Official Development Assistance (ODA) as a key policy to contribute to the international community, with the objective of helping resolve the global issues set out in the United Nations (UN) Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and realizing “quality growth” in developing countries, among others. Japan International Cooperation System (JICS) was established in April 1989 to help promote, in particular, bilateral grants such as grant aid-related operations in ODA. As a “procurement expert” in international cooperation, JICS is engaged in various international cooperation-related projects, in addition to providing procurement agent operations, which involve procurement and management by fulfilling the role of procurement agent for the governments of recipient countries.

In order to contribute to the peace and stability of the international community, JICS—a neutral organization that possesses public procurement know-how—will make aid and international cooperation-related projects tangible in a way that best suits the needs of the front line through the provision of services with even greater added value, with the aim of becoming an international cooperation “integrator” that links various actors’ needs, policies and partners.

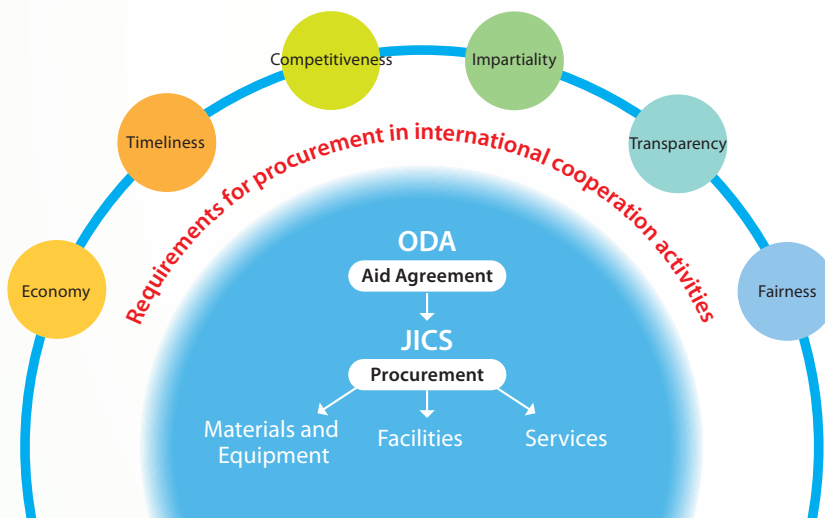
## JICS' Position within Japanese Government's Grant Aid Projects



## JICS' Role

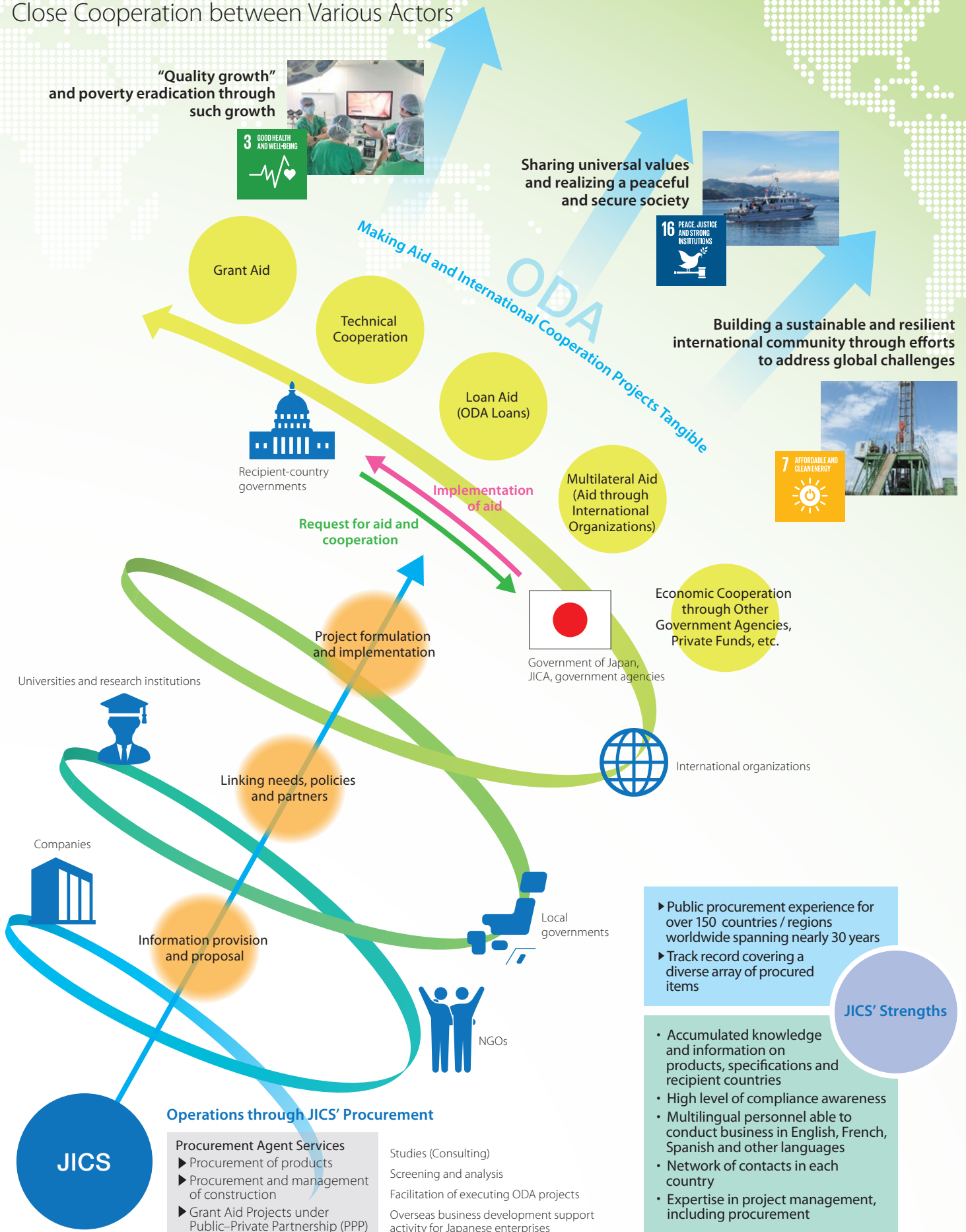
Procurement using ODA funds which are sourced from taxes requires appropriate aid funds management, in addition to the purchase of materials, equipment, facilities and services through tender and other such processes according to public procurement rules, in order to ensure fairness and competitiveness. A procurement organization such as JICS, which has expert knowledge and know-how on public procurement as well as procurement in a wide range of fields, carries out these procedures on behalf of the recipient-country government.

In procurement agent operations, JICS enters into a procurement agent agreement under which JICS will serve as the recipient-country government's procurement agent, and after checking the specifications for materials, equipment and facilities, as well as delivery and construction conditions, JICS executes the tender process, selects suppliers and construction companies and enters into an agreement with them, and manages the progress of the project and the aid funds up until the handover of the materials, equipment and facilities.

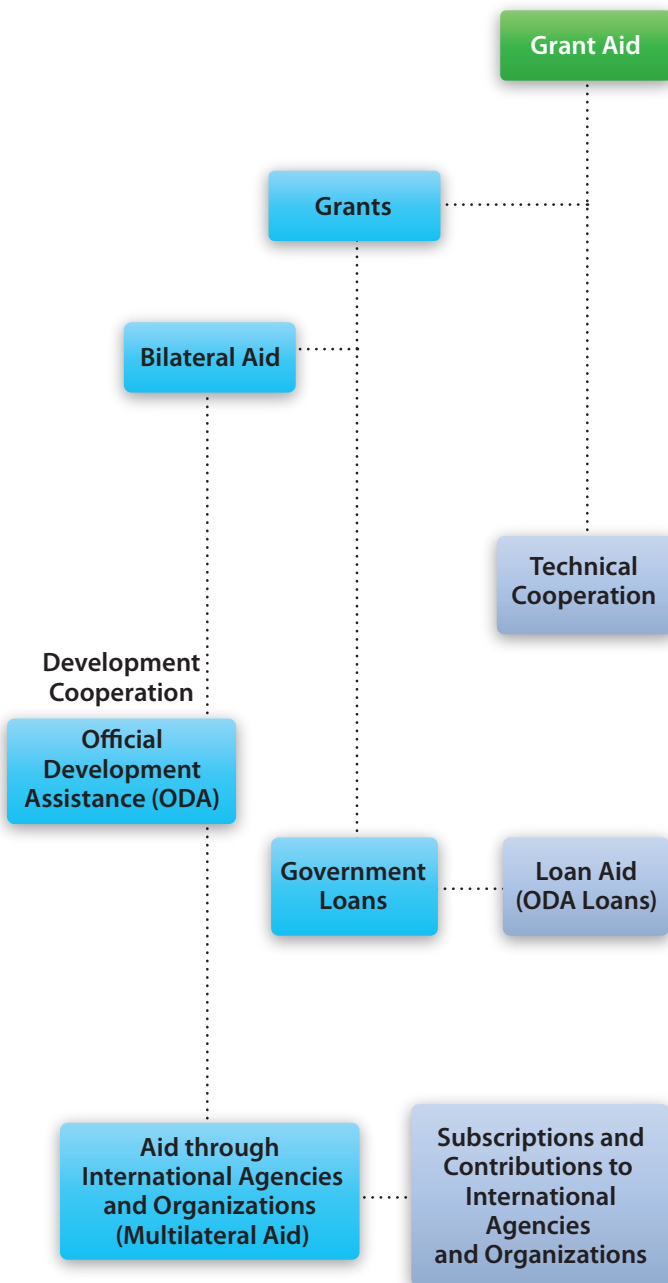

# JICS' Main Activities

JICS is involved in a wide range of ODA-related activities. In particular, within Japan's Grant Aid program (a form of assistance whereby funds are provided to developing countries without the obligation for repayment), JICS' main operations are procurement agent services. In these operations, as the agent of a recipient-country government, JICS provides procurement services and handles project management, including the management of aid funds.

JICS is also engaged in procurement-related operations and studies within technical cooperation projects, loan aid (ODA loans) projects and international cooperation projects by international agencies and organizations.

Utilizing the experience accumulated in these ODA programs, JICS also provides support services to private-sector companies expanding their operations overseas.

## Technical Cooperation-Related Operations

JICS dispatches experts to provide various specialized services. These include: (1) capacity building for procurement staff at the recipient country's project-executing agency, and (2) equipment studies, compilation of specification documentation and procurement operations.

## Loan Aid-Related Operations

Based on services commissioned by JICA, JICS has experience principally in the three types of support operations listed below.

## International Agencies and Organizations-Related Operations

JICS has experience in such procurement operations as utilizing funds from international agencies and organizations: procurement of research equipment, materials for dealing with infectious disease and animal health, disaster-reduction equipment and telecommunications equipment; maintenance of customs

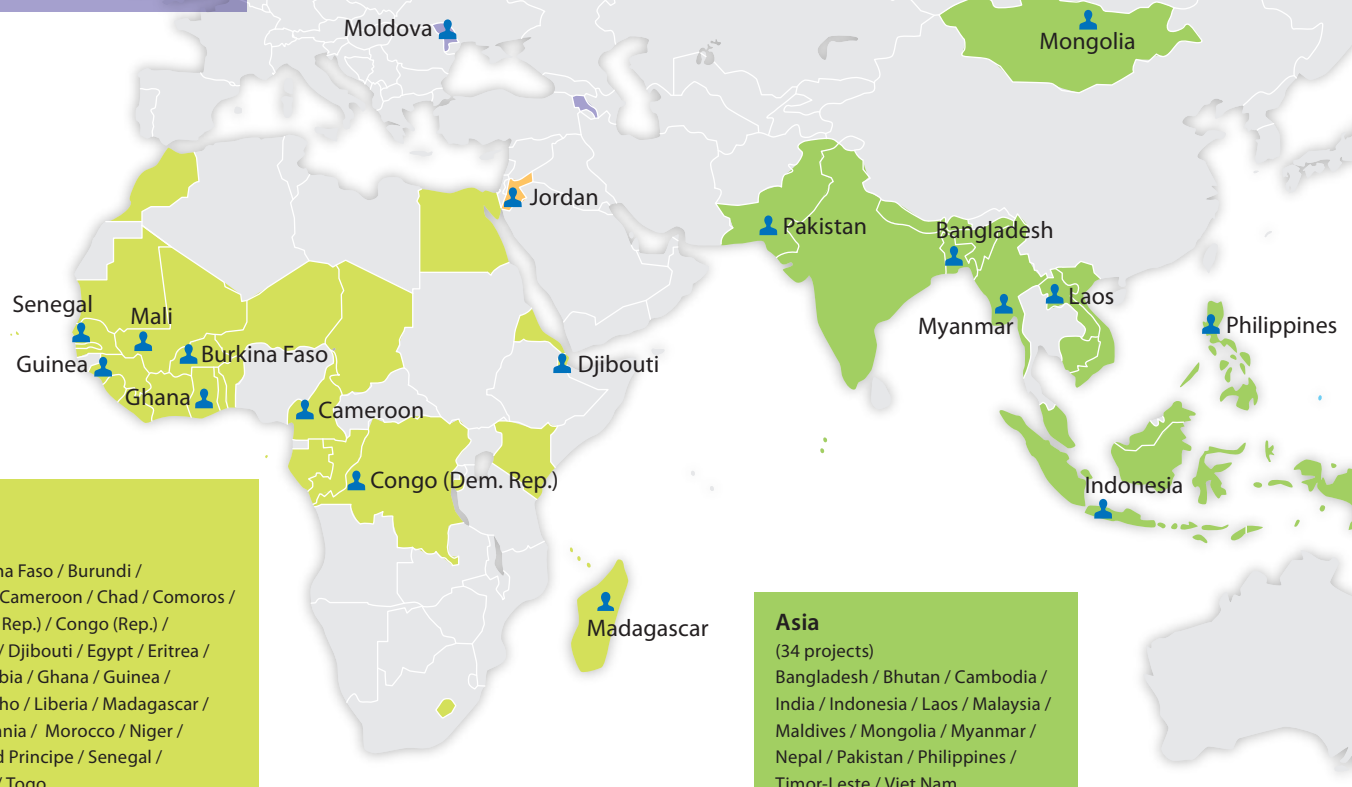

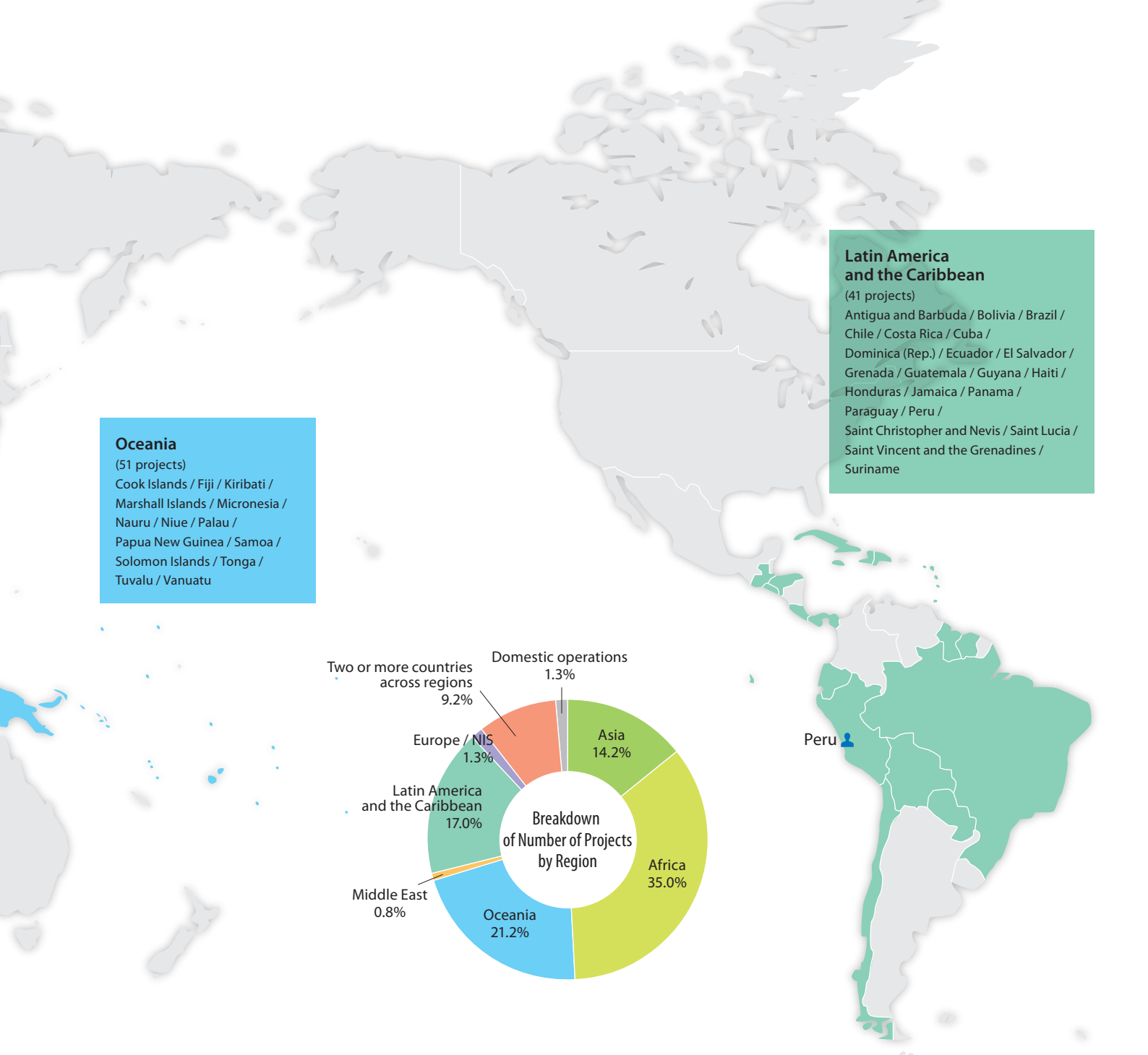
